
Carduus acanthoides

Plumeless Thistle

Other common names: bristly thistle, giant thistle

Asteraceae, the sunflower family

Category: CONTROL



Diagnostic Characteristics

- Winter annual to biennial; grows 3-5 feet tall
- Rosette has wavy leaves with yellow spines along the leaf margin
- Stem leaves alternate
- Stems strongly winged, spiny, non-hairy to light woolly, $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ inch wide, and extend up to the flower heads
- Spherical purple flower heads (solitary or clustered) are 1 inch wide (smaller than musk thistle)
- Bracts on flower head are thin spines

Background

- Native to Eurasia
- Inhabits pastures, fields, non-crop areas, rights-of-way, and disturbed sites
- Reproduces by seed
- Can hybridize with musk thistle
